

Are you ready for the challenge?

By 2030 our Diocese will have roughly 50 priests serving 85 Parishes. Engagement in Parish life is for everyone. Bishop Richard has asked us to consider the following.

- 1 The Mission of the Church is to preach the Good News, to make Jesus known and loved. Can you think of three key things we need to do to achieve this Mission?
- 2 How can lay Parishioners best help fulfil this Mission. What can you do to carry out this Mission?
- 3 What factors do you think have brought about the situation we find ourselves in?

Almost a year ago we gathered a small group of Parishioners together who were willing to lead a weekend service if the priest was unable to say Mass. We need to offer some training to those who are willing. It would be helpful if we had two or three people who would be prepared to lead the service at the Mass they normally attend. There are other simple things that the average Parishioner should be able to do, like operating the lights, opening doors to link, setting up mics, locking the safe. But the big question for all of us is How do we get Parishioners to realise they have an important role to play in passing on the Good News. The Good News can be passed on in many different ways and Like most Parishes in the Diocese we have very faithful and loyal people who are happy to attend Mass but a bit slow volunteering to help. As one Parishioner said to me recently " I got on the roundabout(HELPER) in a previous Parish and I couldn't get off. Don't be afraid to dip your toe in the water.
