

Planning for the future

Bishop Richard will be coming back to our Deanery on Wednesday evening 31st January to listen to any plans we have for the future of our Deanery. He has reminded us that by 2030 our Diocese will have roughly 50 priests serving 85 Parishes and we cannot expect our Parishes to look as they are now. I realise a number of us will probably not be around in 2030. However we want to play our part now as baptised members of Christ's Church. Engagement in Parish life is for everyone. Bishop Richard has asked us to consider the following.

- 1 The Mission of the Church is to preach the Good News, to make Jesus known and loved. Can you think of three key things we need to do to achieve this Mission?
- 2 How can lay Parishioners best help fulfil this Mission. What can you do to carry out this Mission?
- 3 What factors do you think have brought about the situation we find ourselves in?

We will have an open Parish Meeting here in the Hall on **Monday 29**th **January** 8 to 9pm and it would be great if you could be with us and in the meantime give some thought to the above questions.

Almost a year ago we gathered a small group of Parishioners together who were willing to lead a weekend service if the priest was unable to say Mass. We need to offer some training to those who are willing. It would be helpful if we had two or three people who would be prepared to lead the service at the Mass they normally attend. Celebrating the Eucharist is important but what about the other six days of the week.

Seeing your life through the lens of the Gospel

- 1. 'The time is fulfilled' this is a decisive moment in the life of Jesus. His public ministry is about to begin. Recall turning points in your own life when something new happened and with hindsight you can say the time was ripe for it to happen, 'the time was fulfilled'.
- 2. 'Repent and believe the good news.' Jesus was not preaching a new doctrine. He was proclaiming an event that already happened. The time has come. Jesus called for a change of heart as a response to the good news of the gospel message. A new way of understanding God leads to a growth in awareness of who we are and can lead us to a new level of self-confidence, another change of heart.
- 3. The Spirit of God who was at work in Jesus calling the disciples continues to work in our day and in our lives. That is why the gospel message is one of good news.
