# This Sunday is the Second Sunday of

Lent. In the first reading we are told of the covenant that God makes with Abraham, during which a holy terror seizes Abraham. This experience of awe in the presence of God is what also seizes Peter, James and John on Mount Tabor, where they witness Jesus' Transfiguration. This incident, which occurs half way through the Gospel narrative, is often called the most important passage in the New Testament, because through it we are told who Jesus is, and what he will do for us: our vocation is to share in His glory.

This weekend we have two events to which you are all invited: after the 6pm Mass on Saturday, all are very welcome to come to the Hall to watch **The Song of Bernadette**, the famous retelling of the events at Lourdes which won numerous Oscars back in the day. The film will be accompanied by wine and pizza, served at half time. On Sunday we have the **Bus Pass tea party at 3pm**, also in the Hall, to which everyone is invited. The party will feature entertainment. If you wish to drop something off for the party – cakes, etc – please leave it in the sacristy.

Thanks to the generosity of one of our parishioners, we now have a lectern, which will make its appearance generally during Masses in the week. Lecterns cost a fortune, but this one (a fine example, from the Methodist Church in Mark's Tey, Essex) comes second-hand, and at a very modest price. Mass is being offered for the donor of the lectern next Saturday evening. On the Saturday morning, we are offering Mass for the benefactors of the parish in general – all those who

have made donations over the years, including, of course, those who paid for the building. It is fitting that they should be remembered from time to time. Meanwhile we have further benefactions to enjoy: a benefactor has bought us a Missal stand, which has arrived; we are buying some new altar servers' albs with money given by another benefactor; and a benefactor in Italy is sending us a picture of Padre Pio. In addition, a benefactor has given us a picture of Our Lady of Fatima, and another has paid for the framing of the picture of Saint Charbel. Let us pray for them all. We have also received a beautiful picture of St Patrick which we hope will be on display in time for his feast.

#### Liturgical notes:

During Lent there are no feasts unless they are feasts of the first importance. 17 March is, of course, Saint Patrick's Day, but is replaced by the Second Sunday of Lent this year (though you can still celebrate the Saint in the traditional manner, as Sundays are not part of Lent and not penitential days).

Tuesday is the solemnity of Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and patron of the Universal Church. This day too is not counted as part of Lent.

Other Saints' days that fall in Lent are marked as commemorations not feasts. You can usually find details of these saints on our Facebook page and on our twitter stream.

'Scripture Thursdays': on Thursdays in Lent, in the Upper Room starting at 8pm, and ending by 9.30pm at the very latest, we shall be looking at the Passion Narrative of Saint Luke. Please bring a Bible, all welcome. Don't worry if you missed previous sessions. This Friday there will be Stations of the Cross at 7.30pm in Church. This will be an in depth consideration of Stations V to IX inclusive. We shall be singing suitable hymns. This will last no more than half an hour.

Confessions during Lent. Lent is a time to go to confession! There are confessions every Friday at 7pm before Stations. There are confessions on Saturdays at 10.30am until 11.15am (please note the extended time). And we shall have all day Confessions with Adoration on Saturday 30 March from 10.30am to 5.30am, with lots of visiting priests, including Fr Edward Burton, back by popular demand. It is said that the more a parish offers confession the more people will come.... Let us try and prove that right! The visiting confessors will be on hand are as follows: 10.30am Fr Edward Burton 11am Mgr John Hull Noon Canon Oliver Heaney 1pm Fr Peter Fitch 2pm Canon Kieron O'Brien 3pm Fr Ray Blake 4pm Canon Daithi Foley Fr Alexander will be there all day.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament Exposed takes place here every Friday after the 10am Mass for 30 minutes. Jesus is counting on you because the Eucharist is the centre of the Church's life. "Every member of the Church must be vigilant in seeing that the sacrament of love shall be at the centre of the life of the people of God so that through all the manifestations of worship due him shall be given back 'love for love' and truly become the life of our souls." (Pope John Paul II, Redeemer of Man)

You may have read in the Catholic papers that Cardinal Newman is shortly to be made a Saint. This will probably happen in mid-October. The Blessed John Henry Newman is a person of great significance not only in the history of the Church in the nineteenth century in this country, but globally. He is also of local significance as so many in the parish went to a school named after him. On the eve of All Saints, 31 October 2019, we have invited the Right Rev Monsignor Keith Newton, the head of the Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham, which is under the patronage of Blessed John Henry Newman, to visit us and celebrate Mass, and after wards give us a brief talk about the Ordinariate and the significance of the new saint. This will be our way of marking the canonisation. Mgr Keith is an engaging speaker and preacher. Please note the date.
