This Sunday is the Third Sunday of **Lent.** In the first reading Moses encounters God in the Burning Bush, and is given his mission to lead God's people out of slavery in Egypt and to the Promised Land flowing with milk and honey. We are told that God has heard the cry of His people and taken pity on them. In the Gospel we have the parable of the fig tree, which has failed to produce fruit several years running and deserves to be dug up because it is taking up space in the garden. However, the gardener asks that the fig tree be given a second chance; he will fertilise the soil, and hope that it bears fruit next year. If not, then it can be cut down. The implication is clear: Lent is our time of grace, or special favour, our second chance; we may have made little spiritual progress in life until now, but with our Lenten practices to help us, we can perhaps now at long last start to bear fruit. Let us be patient with ourselves, just as God has been patient with us. As for the example of Moses, let us remember that the liberation of the Chosen People was a long process and that forty years has to pass before they could enter the Promised Land; with us too conversion and salvation is a process with many false starts, and sometimes it is so slow that we do not even realise that we are making progress.

This weekend our confirmation candidates are away on a retreat at Saint Bartz in Barcombe near Lewes.

Fr Alexander will be going there on Saturday evening (after the 6pm Mass here) to celebrate Mass for the them. Let us pray that their retreat is a success and will bear spiritual fruit for them. Many thanks to all who have organised this weekend venture.

On Monday at 7pm there is a Vigil Funeral Mass at Rottingdean at 7pm for the late Fr Charles Jeffries. Fr Alexander will be going to represent the parish. All are welcome to attend. Let us keep the late Father Charles in our prayers, and pray as well for vocations to the priesthood.

The Parish Team is meeting on Tuesday. If you have any concerns to raise, or anything you would like them to discuss, please pass it to a member of the team.

Liturgical notes:

During Lent there are no feasts unless they are feasts of the first importance.

Monday is the Solemnity of the Annunciation, the day that marks the annunciation by the Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin, telling her that she is to bear the Saviour. This feast falls exactly nine months before Christmas. This day is not counted as part of Lent. The Gloria and the Creed are recited at Mass.

The purpose of Lent is to prepare us for the ceremonies of Holy Week, which are the most important of the Church's year. Already, plans are afoot, as we contemplate the large number of things that need to be done for Holy Week. Here are a few points to bear in mind.

□ On Palm Sunday, all Masses will start in the Hall; we shall then process into the Church bearing our palms, either through the link if it is raining, or through the main doors and out along the pavement, if it is fine.

□ The Chrism Mass is at 6pm on Wednesday 17 April. It takes place at Arundel and all are invited to see the priests renew their promises and the Bishop bless the Holy Oils. □ On Maundy Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper will start at 8pm. It is proposed to omit the washing of the feet, as is permitted by the Liturgy; the Holy Oils will be received at the offertory; we will construct an Altar of Repose (perhaps in the Sacred Heart Chapel, perhaps elsewhere), and watching at the Altar of Repose will continue until midnight. We will need volunteers to sign up as watchers.

□ On Good Friday, the Liturgy of the Passion is at 3pm. In order to facilitate veneration of the Cross, the faithful will be invited to line up along the altar step (as for the blessing of the throats on the feast of Saint Blaise.)

□ On Holy Saturday there are no liturgical functions at all. This means no confessions and no 6pm Mass. Church cleaners and flower arrangers will have free hand on this day.

□ The Easter Vigil will be at 8pm on Saturday 20 April, which is when dusk will be falling. We will endeavour to have the fire outside, and gather there, before processing into the Church with the Easter candle. Rob Noble will sing the Exultet. We shall be having four readings, and so will need four readers. It would be a great help if people could agree to read when asked. Fr Alexander will be approaching people with a list.

□ On Easter Sunday morning Masses are as normal. At each Mass there will be the renewal of the baptismal promises, and at the 10am Mass we have an infant baptism.

'Scripture Thursdays': on Thursdays in Lent, in the Upper Room starting at 8pm, and ending by 9.30pm at the very latest, we shall be looking at the Passion Narrative of Saint Luke. Please bring a Bible, all welcome. Don't worry if you missed previous sessions.

This Friday there will **be Stations of the Cross** at 7.30pm in Church. This will be an in depth consideration of Stations IX to XIV inclusive. We shall be singing suitable hymns. This will last no more than half an hour. Next Friday, 5 April, we will be having our Taizé service, so there will be no Stations; after that we shall be having the full 15 Stations all at once on 12 April.

Confessions during Lent. Lent is a time to go to confession! There are confessions every Friday at 7pm before Stations. There are confessions on Saturdays at 10.30am until 11.15am (please note the extended time). And we shall have all day Confessions with Adoration on Saturday 30 March from 10.30am to 5.30am, with lots of visiting priests, including Fr Edward Burton, back by popular demand. It is said that the more a parish offers confession the more people will come.... Let us try and prove that right! The visiting confessors will be on hand are as follows:
