This Sunday is the Third Sunday of **Easter.** The Gospel of Saint John tells us of Jesus' appearance to His disciples by the shores of the lake, and the miraculous draught of fishes. The disciples, we remember, are called to be fishers of men, but it is clear that Saint Peter will have to pay a price for this great vocation. The same message is to be found in the first reading. Peter and John respond to the call they receive from the Lord to proclaim the message boldly, and even though they are punished for it, they are happy "to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name." We too need to see our baptismal vocation in the same light: a great gift from the Lord, to be embraced with joy, but something that will require sacrifices of us. We do not believe in the doctrine of "cheap grace". that is, the belief that heaven is to be gained without some personal cost to ourselves. As Dietrich Bonhoeffer said: "Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession. absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate." Bonhoeffer knew what he was talking about: he was the Lutheran pastor who boldly stood up to Hitler and was martyred as a result.

This Sunday, our Oriental Orthodox brethren will be celebrating the Divine Liturgy at 5pm. We are very happy to have them! Do come along to experience their Liturgy if you wish, which is celebrated in Arabic and Aramaic, the language of Our Lord Himself. In the meantime, let us all pray fervently for the unity of all Christians, East and West. Next weekend is the Fourth Sunday of Easter, which is also called Good Shepherd Sunday and is also the day of prayer for vocations. On this day we shall have the retiring collection for the training of future priests. Indeed, we have quite a lot on next weekend.

□ Dr Kilmartin will be speaking at the end of every Mass to raise awareness in the parish about Cardinal Newman School. There will be a sermon, but it will be very short.

□ After the 6pm Mass on Saturday we are showing our parish film in the Hall, with wine and pizza served at half time. All are invited. The film is Brother Sun, Sister Moon (1972) and is the story of Saint Francis as imagined by the great film director Franco Zeffirelli. It is a gorgeous feast for the senses, and lasts 2 hours; it is suitable for all ages; all are invited.

□ After the 11.15am Mass on Sunday you are all invited into the Hall to celebrate Adrian's recent birthday and his retirement from 32 years' serving on the altar. This is our chance to show our huge gratitude to him.

We have received the sad news of the death of George Lamb, who died at home early on Easter Monday. George, as many of you know, was our parish treasurer for many years, and the trusted collaborator of the late Canon Reynell and more recently Father Jerry. He had received the Sacrament of the Sick some time previously. Let us continue to pray for the repose of his soul, and for the comfort of his widow Caroline and their children. George's funeral Mass will take place here on Friday 17 May at 12 noon. followed by burial at Hove Cemetery. This will replace the 10am Mass on that day.

We have a new picture, the gift of a kind benefactor. It is the famous picture of the

Divine Mercy, the devotion that began with Saint Faustina, and which was deeply dear to Saint John Paul II. The picture now hangs in the Sacred Heart chapel. Divine Mercy Sunday was last Sunday, but perhaps next year we should hold the Divine Mercy devotions on that day. In the meantime, let us remind ourselves that Jesus is the fount of love and mercy! Let us remember the donor of the picture in our prayers.

The Parish Finance Committee meets this Tuesday. This is the committee that advises the parish priest on financial matters and things to do with the upkeep of the building. Liturgical Notes:

We are now in the month of May, which is specially dedicated to Our Lady. During this month we should aim to sing more of the traditional hymns to the Blessed Virgin and to pray the Rosary more. To this end, after the weekday Mass, when there is no Exposition, we shall recite the Rosary communally. In addition, we can all say the Rosary at home.

The Rosary, Part Two: Rosary means a crown of roses, a spiritual bouquet given to the Blessed Mother. It is sometimes called the Dominican Rosary, to distinguish it from other rosary-like prayers (e.g. the Franciscan Rosary of the Seven Joys or Franciscan Crown, the Servite Rosary of the Seven Sorrows). It is also, in a general sense, a form of chaplet or corona (crown), of which there are many varieties in the Church. Finally, in English it has been called 'Our Lady;s Psalter'; or 'the beads.' This last derives from an Old English word for prayers (bede) and to request (biddan or bid).

The rosary has been called the preparation for contemplation and the prayer of saints. While the hands and lips are occupied with the prayers (it can and should be praved silently when necessary so as not to disturb others), the mind meditates on the mysteries of the Incarnation and Redemption represented by the decades. Meditation is the form of prayer by which the one who prays uses the mind and imagination to consider a truth and uses the will to love it and form resolutions to live it. In this way the heart, mind, and soul of the Christian is formed according to the Gospel examples of the Saviour and His First Disciple, His Mother. In God';s own time, when this purification of the heart, mind, and soul has advanced sufficiently the Lord may give the grace of contemplative prayer, that special divine insight into the truth which human effort cannot achieve on its own.

"I see you have had some work

done!" [Part Three] By the time you read this, all the work in the presbytery and the sacristies will have been completed. Many have already made positive comments on the floors! You will also notice the scaffolding outside the Church and inside the Church – this is to facilitate the installation of the new stained glass window. For the moment this means that organ is out of action. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament Exposed takes place here every Friday after the 10am Mass for 30 minutes. Just as you can't be exposed to the sun without receiving its rays, neither can you come to Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament without receiving the divine rays of his grace, his love, his peace. 'Christ is truly the Emmanuel, that is, God with us, day and night, he is in our midst. He dwells with us full of grace and truth. He restores morality, nourishes virtue, consoles the afflicted, strengthens the weak.' (Pope Paul VI, Mysterium Fidei)
