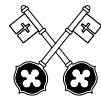

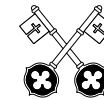

### This Sunday is the Thirty-Third

**Sunday of the Year.** We are getting close to the feast of Christ the King and the end of the Liturgical year. As befits the season, the readings focus on what

is called the eschaton, more commonly known as the end of the world. The prophet Malachi alludes to some terrifying event when the Lord will come as judge, and sort out the good people from the bad. In the Gospel we hear Jesus' words on the end, which are markedly more moderate, in that He counsels us not to be afraid or alarmed by rumours. Jesus' words allude to the destruction of Jerusalem and its Temple, and also to the persecution of His followers, something that continues to this day in many countries. His words are apocalyptic, but should not lead us to think that the end of the world is imminent or that we should become obsessed with looking for signs of the coming end. Nevertheless, we should live as people who know that the world we live in is not permanent and that only the things of God are permanent; and that one day all things will be brought to a conclusion in Christ.

This Sunday, our film for all the family is The Sound of Music which starts at 5pm. Soft drinks and pizza will be served at half time, at around 6.30pm. The audience is invited to sing along and to dress up as your favourite character. All are invited.

Next Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King, which is the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. The 10am Mass is going to be an **'International Mass'**, reflecting the diversity of our parish, and indeed the diversity of the Universal Church. We would like to represent as many of the home nations of our parishioners as possible. Advent begins on 1 December, and with it a new liturgical year, and with it our four Sundays of preparation for Christmas. So we can make the most of Advent, and so we can prepare ourselves to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion at Christmas, there will be a day of Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament Exposed, on the feast of Saint Andrew, Saturday, 30 November, the eve of Advent Sunday, from after Mass at 10.30am to 4pm. Everyone is invited to come to Church to adore the Lord, and a priest will be in attendance to hear confessions for all of that time. At 4pm there will be Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Let's get our preparation for Christmas in early!

#### **Liturgical Notes:**

November is dedicated to prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. On days on which there is no feast and on which the Mass is being offered for a deceased person or for all the Holy Souls we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the Dead.

Monday is the feast of the Dedication of the Basilicas of SS Peter and Paul.

Friday is the feast of Saint Cecilia, virgin and martyr, patron saint of music.

Saturday is the feast of Saint Clement, pope and martyr.

Her funeral service will take place here on Friday 29 November at 11am, and will be followed by burial at Hove Cemetery. There will be Mass at 10am on that day as usual.

On Friday 22 November, from 6pm to 8pm, we are having Altar Servers' training in Church, followed by fun and games and pizza in the Hall. Emails have been sent out to interested parties. If you would like to serve, do please come along.

Our Social Club meets every Friday from 1.30pm to 3.30pm. All are welcome, and please bring along all your friends! This coming Friday, 22 November, we shall be watching the film *The Lady in the Van*, starring Dame Maggie Smith in the title role.

The honour paid to the Blessed Sacrament lies at the heart of the Catholic faith. Let us never forget that the Blessed Sacrament is the Body,

Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. In honouring the Blessed Sacrament - by genuflecting on coming into Church for example - we honour the Real Presence of Christ Himself in our midst. Therefore, we must be vigilant in protecting the Blessed Sacrament from all disrespect. Recently, at a Church in our deanery, the priest found that some one had desecrated the Sacred Host. This is distressing, and I will spare you the details, but these things do happen, either intentionally or not. (Likewise, in America, there was a recent case of someone offering Consecrated Hosts for sale on the internet: there had been taken from Catholic Churches, and were being offered to groups who practice the desecration known as the 'Black Mass'.) As a result of this, it is really important that all who come to receive Holy Communion do so as soon as the Host is placed in their hands or on their tongue. The Sacred Host is to be consumed immediately, and in view of the priest or extraordinary minister. If you have questions about this, your priest is happy to try and answer them. On a similar subject, do come up for a blessing if you are not receiving Holy Communion for whatever reason, but do make it clear you wish to be blessed by placing your arms crossed in front of you. This will be very helpful in avoiding confusion; young children of pre-Communion age may need this explained to them, and parents are best placed to do this. In addition, please remember that some people do not want to join the procession for Holy Communion and wish, for whatever reason, to remain in their seats. Please do not urge them to leave their seats as this may embarrass them.

How can we all be more green? This is a question we should be asking ourselves frequently, in accordance with

the wishes of our Bishop and indeed Pope Francis himself. One way is to avoid the unnecessary use of paper. It is incredible how much junk mail arrives at the Presbytery that goes straight into recycling – but there is nothing we can do about that. However, in about 5 years' time, when our new photocopier is coming to the end of its life, we should be aiming to have an electronic newsletter only. That is to say, everyone will be able to access news about the parish via their computer and/or phone, and we will do without a printed version, the printing of which is costly and time consuming. To this end, do please visit our website, our Facebook page and our Twitter stream for daily updates, and if you can, join the Facebook group or follow on Twitter. In addition, going paper-free will save a great deal of money, and well as the labour of printing formatting and printing out this newsletter.
