Day of Recollection for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Saturday 8th December.

The day will start at 10am with Mass. After coffee, we shall have a period of spiritual reflection on the nature of the Eucharist and the Eucharistic sacrifice. and the role of the Extraordinary Minister in the liturgy and the way the Extraordinary Minister extends the Eucharistic celebration to those who cannot be physically present. We will reflect on the centrality of the Eucharist and the Real presence in the Church's life, and the love and duty that we owe to the Blessed Sacrament and on our dignity as baptised persons called to participate in the Heavenly Banquet of the Mass. Lunch will follow, which will be provided. After lunch, there will be a practical session in which we shall look at the various practicalities in our parish, particularly the way in which we minister to the housebound, and other matters as well, including any concerns that may arise. Finally the day will end with a period of silent adoration in Church, in which we can dedicate ourselves to renewed service to the Church through this important ministry.

We plan to hold similar days for Welcomers and for Readers, both of which are important ministries in the life of the Church. These will happen after Christmas, but you might like to note the dates now. These sessions are for those currently engaged in welcoming and

reading, and for all those who would like to become welcomers and readers. (We seem to have a particular need for new readers. Please consider this ministry, even if, indeed particularly if, your first language is not English - this is after all an international Church!)

The Readers' day will be on Saturday 26th January, the feast of saints Timothy and Titus. The Welcomers' day will be on Saturday 9th February.

This Sunday is the 33rd Sunday of the Year. We are now getting close to the end of the liturgical year and the readings, as you might expect, deal with the topic of the end of the world. The first, from the prophet Daniel, gives us the vision of the resurrection of the dead and the Last Judgement, which is depicted for us on the wall of the Sistine Chapel by Michelangelo: some will be called to Heaven, others will go down to everlasting shame, according to whether their deeds in life were good or bad. Jesus in the gospel refers to the time of great tribulation, followed by the glorious second coming of the Son of Man. Just what this means requires careful interpretation in accordance with the tradition of the Church and its perennial teaching on the Four Last Things: death, judgement, heaven and hell.

This Sunday at 4pm, we shall have Vespers for the Dead followed by Rosary. 'At the going down of the sun we shall remember them'.

This Sunday at 5pm, Father Ephraim, of the Syriac Orthodox Church, is celebrating the Divine Liturgy for members of his community. The Syriac Orthodox Church is under the authority of the Orthodox Patriarch of Antioch, and in communion with the Patriarch of Constantinople. There are many Syrians living in Hove who are members of the Syriac Orthodox Church. This is a rare opportunity for us to witness the Eastern Liturgy at first hand, so do come along if you wish. The Divine Liturgy will last approximately an hour and half. Afterwards the Hall will be available.

Liturgical Notes:

In November, when there is no feast day, we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the dead, provided the Mass intention is for a deceased person; that is to say that we shall celebrate the Mass in the Missal designated 'for several deceased persons or for all the dead.' Wednesday is the feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Friday is the feast of Saint Clement, pope and martyr. Saturday is the feast of Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and his companions, martyrs of Vietnam.

Advent consists of the four Sundays before Christmas and the intervening days, which means it is a short season, running from 2nd December to the evening of the 24th December, just over three weeks. We should all try to use this time well, and if we do so, we will find Christmas that more rewarding.

Advent is a time when the faithful are urged to go to Confession. The sacrament of reconciliation is available at the usual times (Saturdays 10.30-11am) and in addition on Saturday 15th December, we shall have confessions all day with Adoration, from after the morning Mass until the evening Mass. Various visiting priests will be present to hear confessions, and a list will be posted in due course. The **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** will help us all to focus our minds on the coming of the Lord. If you wish to sign up for an hour of watching in front of the Blessed sacrament, there will be a list in the Sacristy shortly.

Don't forget our other Advent initiative, namely the four sessions on St Luke's Infancy Narrative (Saint Luke, chapters one and two) on Thursdays, starting on November 29th at 8pm in the Upper Room. All are invited. Please bring a Bible with you.
