**This Sunday is the Thirty-First of the Year.** The readings carry on the theme of last week's readings, namely that of repentance before God. We are assured in the first reading that God is loving and merciful, and that He overlooks our sins so we can have time and opportunity to repent. Moreover, God is gradually leading us to greater self-knowledge, so that we may grow in holiness. In the Gospel we have an example of someone who has come to know himself and his own sinfulness and who casts himself on the mercy of the Lord, namely Zacchaeus, a tax collector of Jericho. Zacchaeus gives up his materialistic and greedy life to welcome the Lord into his house, and makes reparation for his past sins, by paying back all the people he has cheated four times over. In so doing he turns from being a lost person to being someone saved by the grace of God.

This Sunday the annual Blessing of Graves takes place at 2.30pm at Hove Cemetery, meeting in the north part of the cemetery. (Please note this revised time. It is the same time at other cemeteries in the city.)

Thanks to those of you who took forms to do with Gift Aid last week. This is the scheme by which, at no extra cost to yourselves, you can boost the parish's income by helping us to claim some of your money back from the taxman. Gift Aid is a very valuable source of income for many parishes, our own included. If you were absent, and would like to know more, please speak to Vincent our treasurer. (An email to the parish will be forwarded.)

Next Sunday is the Thirty-Second of the Year. On this day after the 10am Mass there is going to be a Cake Sale in the Hall in aid of Cafod, the Catholic Fund for

Overseas Development. Please support our Cafod group by buying lots of delicious cakes. If anyone would like to donate cakes, please bring them to the hall before Mass. Next Sunday is also the Sunday nearest to Armistice Day, so is Remembrance Sunday. The 11.15am Mass will be for the War Dead. On the same day, our Confirmation course begins at 7pm in the Hall. We have 22 young people registered for confirmation. Let us pray for them and their catechists.

Our stained glass debt stands at £16,955. Don't forget our **Advent table top sale on Sunday 8 December**. Would you like to book a table? If so, please express your interest to Fr Alexander as soon as possible. Someone will make an appearance under the guise of Saint Nicholas at the sale, and give presents out to children! Mary Senior is going to be selling delicious foodstuffs (including deep fried Mars bars!) and Mary Junior is going to be selling children's toys. Any other ideas?

Who is Saint Nicholas? He lived in the time of the Roman Empire and is the patron saint of children. While he was bishop of Myra, he was renowned for his acts of kindness to the young, often dropping presents through open windows to people in need. Hence, he is associated with present giving. His feast is 6 December.

Confessions are heard every Saturday morning, from 10.30 to 11.15am.

The next baptism class will be on Monday 6 January in the Hall. If you have a baby to be baptised, you need to see Fr Alexander first before being enrolled in the class. Please email him, and he will be round to see you at home.

### **Liturgical Notes:**

November is dedicated to prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. On days on which there is no feast and on which the Mass is being offered for a deceased person or for all the Holy Souls we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the Dead.

Monday is the feast of Saint Charles Borromeo. Saturday is the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica.

The funeral Mass of Peggy Haslam, who died on Monday 21 October in Grosvenor Lodge, will take place on Wednesday 6 November, at 11am, followed by burial at Portslade Cemetery. (This will replace the 10am Mass that day.) Peggy had recently received the sacrament of the Sick and the Apostolic Pardon. May she rest in peace, and may God comfort her family. Her son-in-law is Vincent Joyce, our parish treasurer.

Let us continue to pray for Adam Lea Hinton, who died on 26 September at the age of 43. His funeral service will take place on Friday 8 November at 11.30am, followed by burial at Woodingdean. Let us also remember in our prayers Pat Winter, who used to live in Ingram Crescent until recently, and who died on Monday 21 October, at her nursing home in Shoreham. Pat's funeral Mass will be at 1pm on Friday 15 November at 1pm. (There will be 10am Mass followed by Adoration on that day.)

**Ecumenical Notes:** This Sunday our friends from the Syriac Orthodox Church will celebrate their Divine Liturgy (what we commonly call Mass) in our Church at 5.30pm. Some of you have attended in the past and know that the languages used are Arabic, Aramaic (the language of Jesus Himself) and

English. On 24 November, the Antiochene Orthodox Church is going to celebrate the Divine Liturgy in the evening. Both communities have many members in the Syrian community, and Christians in Syria belong to a wide variety of Churches which fall into four major groupings: Protestants, Catholics (which includes Catholics of the Latin rite and Catholics of other rites, such as the Melchites), Oriental Orthodox (such as the Syriacs) and Eastern Orthodox (such as the Antiochenes). Many of these churches use nearly identical rites, but the Catholics are in communion with the See of Rome, the Eastern Orthodox with the See of Constantinople and/or Moscow, and the Oriental Orthodox are in communion with none of the above, though it is to be noted that the Oriental Orthodox enjoy warm relations, though not communion, with Rome. Anyway, we are happy to welcome our Orthodox friends of all communions. This is part of our commitment to ecumenism which starts with friendly relations with our churches.

Our Social Club meets every Friday from 1.30pm to 3.30pm. All are welcome, and please bring along all your friends! This coming Friday, 8 November, Charlotte Nicklas, who is an expert in the matter, is going to talk to us about her interest in historic dress and textiles.
