This Sunday is the 31st Sunday of the Year. The first reading tells us how God

promises the Children of Israel peace and prosperity if they keep the Law that He has given them. In the Gospel, Jesus explains the 'double precept of charity' and how the Law consists of two things which are related to each other: the love of God and the love of our neighbour. These do not contradict each other but rather reinforce each other. The more we love God, the more we shall love our neighbour too.

This Sunday there is the annual collection at the end of Mass for the retired priests' fund. The diocese informs us: 'Every year at least £200,000 is needed for the support of our retired priests. The amounts incurred are likely to increase in coming years as more priests reach retirement age. This support ensures that priests do not face financial hardship when their parish ministry comes to an end. While in active parish ministry, priests' accommodation and domestic needs are met by the parish and a modest personal income is usually provided from offerings at Christmas. Easter and from baptisms. weddings and funerals. There is no charge to the parish for pension contributions to fund the future needs for their priest. The Retired Priests' Fund supplies these needs, whether the priest is able to live independently or whether more care is required. In recent years, this collection has contributed only a fraction of the amount needed. Please give generously so that we can express our concern and gratitude towards those who have served us so loyally over the years.

This Sunday at 3pm, there will be a brief service and blessing of the graves at Hove Cemetery, North. All are welcome to attend, indeed encouraged, to take part in this pious practice, even if you have no relations and friends buried in the cemetery in question.

This Sunday at 4pm, we shall have Vespers for the Dead followed by Rosary. The Office does not take long, and the Rosary is an excellent way to pray for the faithful departed and for peace in the world. Do please come along. If you have a Morning and Evening Prayer book, do bring it along too, but this is not necessary, as books will be provided.) The combined Rosary and Office will not take more than half an hour. 'At the going down of the sun we shall remember them'. Liturgical Notes:

In November, when there is no feast day, we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the dead, provided the Mass intention is for a deceased person; that is to say that we shall celebrate the Mass in the Missal designated 'for several deceased persons or for all the dead.'

Friday is the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica.

Saturday is the feast of Saint Leo the Great, pope.

Sunday is the 32nd Sunday of the Year, and also Remembrance Sunday. The 11.15am Mass on this day will be a Mass of Requiem for the War Dead. This Mass will mark to the day and hour the hundredth anniversary of the end of the First World War.

**Training for servers.** It is proposed that all servers who wish to find out more about serving on the altar, should gather at 6pm in the church on **Friday 30th November**. At this session we will also explain the purpose of enrolment in the Guild of Saint Stephen. Afterwards we will go for fish and chips, or pizza. Parents of servers, please note the date now; the session will finish by 8pm. Because of child/adult ratios, if parents want to stay for the session and the fish and chips, please feel free; otherwise leave contact details.

October is the month on which we are asked to count the congregation; an average is then taken which is submitted to the diocese as our attendance figure. Here are the figures: Sunday 7 th October: 6pm – 88; 8.30am – 100; 10am – 207; 11.15am – 155. Total of 550.

Sunday 14 th October: 6pm-120; 8.30am -137; 10am – 177; 11.15am – 160. Total of 594.

Sunday 21 st October: 6pm – 118; 8.30am – 75; 10am – 190; 11.15am – 132. Total of 515. Sunday 28 th : 6pm -97; 8.3am -106; 10am -216; 11.15am – 114. Total of 533.

This gives an average of 548. These figures will be forwarded to the diocese which has asked, this year, to have the exact figures for

each Mass. In a few years' time the Bishop will be looking at Mass provision in our deanery, and adjusting Mass times, so this data will be useful for him. We had better buy clickers for use next year to make the count as accurate as possible.

Volunteers please to Father Alexander. The programme consists of Dvorak's Mass in D Major, along with Parry's Songs of Farewell, interspersed with suitable readings of poetry.

Well done to everyone who made the table top sale in the Hall last Sunday the success it was. It raised £205.45 for the stainedglass appeal. Many thanks in particular to the Union of Catholic Mothers. We still have a lot more money to raise. Anyone got any initiatives that they would like to undertake?

On Tuesday 13th November there is Mass for the deceased clergy of the deanery at Sacred Heart at 11am. All the deanery priests will be concelebrating. This is an annual event to which all are invited. Among those remembered will be al deceased past parish clergy of this parish, naturally. On that day there will be no 10am Mass here.

The Parish team is meeting on Thursday 15th November. If you have any items for the agenda or anything you think needs to be discussed, please make them known to Fr Alexander or to a member of the team. The meeting will take place in the Upper Room. Talking of which, the said room, sometimes called the Green Room, has been cleaned and reclaimed for parish use. The key is freely available to all who need it – if you fall into that category, please familiarise yourself with where it is kept. Many thanks to the team of volunteers who cleaned and tidied the room in record time.

As you will have read elsewhere in this newsletter, priests in this diocese are not paid a regular salary, but instead have their needs of food and shelter provided, are given the Christmas and Easter collections. and also receive stipends for weddings, funerals, baptisms along with (not mentioned above) Mass offerings. These last are traditionally the mainstay of the priest's income. Every Mass is the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross offered for all the living and all the dead; but it is also possible for the priest to keep a named person, living or dead, in mind at Mass. In gratitude for this the person who requests this makes an offering which is supposed to cover the cost of the priest's main meal that day. In Kenya, it was not unusual for the priest to be given a goat as a Mass offering, which would keep him going for several days. In this diocese, the faithful are recommended to give £10, but it is perfectly OK to give less according to circumstances. These offerings should be placed in the envelopes found in the back of the Church, with the details of the request on the envelope, and handed to the Presbytery. Incidentally, this newsletter always lists the intention of each Mass, which is also announced at the start of each Mass. RIP means rest in peace or requiescat in pace, in other words that the person has died, and that we are praying for their soul (most appropriate in November). GE stands for

'good estate', and that we are praying for a living person and their welfare.
