Sunday 3 November 10am Holy Souls Sunday 3 November 11.15am Anthony Reynaud RIP This Sunday is the Thirtieth of the Year. Today there will be a very short sermon, and after Holy Communion, Vincent, our parish treasurer, is going to speak to us about the very important subject of Gift Aid. This is the scheme by which, at no extra cost to yourselves, you can boost the parish's income by helping us to claim some of your money back from the taxman. Gift Aid is a very valuable source of income for many parishes, our own included.

The readings today carry on the theme of last week's readings, and are once more about prayer. In the first reading, we are told that God listens to the prayer of the poor and humble person. The Gospel takes the same idea up with the story of the Pharisee and the tax collector who both go up to pray at the Temple. The Pharisee is full of self-congratulation, while the tax collector acknowledges his sinfulness before the Lord. It is obvious which example we should follow. This parable must have infuriated and confounded Jesus' hearers, but - as the first reading tells us - God is just and will always listen to the petitioner who expresses real and sincere need. Perhaps the lesson for us is that we should pray from and with the heart, in complete sincerity, rather than telling God what we think He wants to hear, or telling ourselves what we wish were true.

This week there are several events happening in our parish. On Thursday, the eve of All Saints, we will celebrate the canonisation of Saint John Henry Newman. Mass is at 7.30pm, and is being celebrated by Monsignor Keith Newton, the head of the Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham, which exists to preserve the positive patrimony of Anglicanism inside the Catholic Church. There is a reception following the Mass, when the Monsignor will speak, as will

Luke Kilgallon, our own parish delegate to the canonisation. Friday is the Solemnity of All Saints, and Mass is at the usual time of 10am. Saturday is the commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, All Souls, and Mass is at 10am, which will be offered for all those who have died and for all those in mourning. In particular we will remember those who have died in the last year. Afterwards there will be a reception in the Hall. Attendance at Mass will be a way of expressing your solidarity with the bereaved and your commitment to pray for them and the faithful departed.

Next Sunday is the Thirty-First of the Year and the annual Blessing of Graves is at 2.30pm at Hove Cemetery, meeting in the north part of the cemetery. (Please note this revised time. It is the same time at other cemeteries in the city.)

We have finalised the dates for our Confirmation course, and we have been advised that the Confirmation itself will take place on Saturday 4 July at **3pm**, here at Saint Peter's. Please note the date! The first session is going to be on Sunday November 10, at 7pm in the Hall. There is a letter with all the dates at the back of the Church. We would like people to sign up by the end of October, so this week is more or less your last chance. The letter tells you what you need to do to register. Please take a copy and do remind anyone who needs to know! Confirmation candidates should be in Year Ten or above. The Bishop will be making a personal visit to our Confirmation candidates on Sunday 1 March.

Our stained glass debt stands at £16,955. Don't forget our Advent table top sale on Sunday 8 December. Would you like to book a table? If so, please express your interest to Fr Alexander as

soon as possible. Someone will make an appearance under the guise of Saint Nicholas at the sale, and give presents out to children!

Confessions are heard every Saturday morning, from 10.30 to 11.15am.

The next baptism class will be on Monday 6 January in the Hall. If you have a baby to be baptised, you need to see Fr Alexander first before being enrolled in the class. Please email him, and he will be round to see you at home.

Liturgical Notes:

October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and prayer for the Missions. November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. On days on which there is no feast and on which the Mass is being offered for a deceased person or for all the Holy Souls we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the Dead.

Monday is the feast of Saints Simon and Jude, apostles.

Thursday is the eve of All Saints.

Friday is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation.

Saturday is the commemoration of All Souls.

The funeral Mass of Veronica Green will take place at 11am on Tuesday 29 October. She died on 11 October 2019 at St George's retreat in Ditchling and was 98 years old. May her soul rest in peace. There will be no 10am Mass that day. All are invited to the funeral. Veronica's body will be committed for cremation at the Church door, which is a perfectly correct way of doing things.

The family of Malvina Sanders, the former Head of Cardinal Newman School are holding a very small, family only funeral. There will be a Service of

Celebration at the school on Saturday 2 November at 2.30pm. Everyone is welcome. This is being organised by Dr Kilmartin and Fr Jerry.

We have also heard the sad news of the death of Adam Hinton, who died on 26 September at the age of 43. His funeral Mass will take place on Friday 8 November at 11.30am, followed by burial at Woodingdean. (There will be 10am Mass followed by Adoration on that day.) Let us keep Adam in our prayers, and let us also pray for his grieving mother, Paulina Coleman, and his teenage daughter, Jasmine.

We have also heard the sad news of the death of Peggy Haslam, who died on Monday 21 October in Grosvenor Lodge. Peggy had recently received the sacrament of the Sick and the Apostolic Pardon. May she rest in peace, and may God comfort her family. Her son-inlaw is Vincent Joyce, our parish treasurer. Her funeral will take place on Wednesday 6 November at 11am.

Finally, we have heard the sad news of the death, on Monday 21 October, at her nursing home in Shoreham, of Pat Winter who used to live in Ingram Crescent until recently. May she too rest in peace! Her Requiem Mass will be at 1pm on Friday 15 November, followed by burial at Hove Cemetery.
