# **Confessions next Saturday**

This Sunday is the 30th Sunday of the Year. The first reading contains God's promise to His people to restore them to the land of Israel after the hardship of exile. In the Gospel, Jesus restores the sight of Bartimaeus, who immediately follows him along the road. The link between the two readings is in this idea of restoration: God. though His Son, Jesus our Saviour, promises to restore our humanity to its fullness, by taking away not just sin but the effects of sin. We are all blinded and held back by our sinful nature, which we have inherited as part of our human condition. Jesus has come to set us free, to liberate us, and to give us the fullness of the life of God's children.

This Sunday we are having another table top sale in the Hall after all Masses, in aid of the stained glass appeal. Please do look at what is on offer. Lots of foreign coins and banknotes, none any longer legal tender, but all collectors' items, for example!

Next Sunday there is the annual collection at the end of Mass for the retired priests fund. We have an ageing number of priests so rely heavily on this collection. There is no charge to the parish for pension contributions to fund retirement for priests. The Retirement Priests' Fund supplies priests with the means to live independently or with care provision if needed. Please give generously so we can express our concern and gratitude towards those who have served us loyally over the years.

## **Liturgical Notes:**

We are now almost at the end of the month of October which is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Very soon we shall be entering the month of November which is dedicated to prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. During this month we should all make a special effort of pray for the dead, those we have known, and those who have no one else to pray for them. November begins with two major liturgical days. The first is the Solemnity of All Saints, which is on the first day of the month, and is a holy day of obligation. Mass will be at 10am and at 7.30pm. The following day is the commemoration of All Souls; Mass will also be at 10am and 7.30pm. Please

make a special effort to attend, particularly on the 1st November. In the first week of November it is customary to visit a cemetery to pray for the dead; under the usual conditions this carries an indulgence. On the first Sunday in November, the 4th, there will be a brief service and blessing of the graves in our own cemetery and other cemeteries in Brighton and Hove, all at 3pm (unless otherwise stated). All are welcome to attend, indeed encouraged, to take part in this pious practice, even if you have no relations and friends buried in the cemetery in question. The cemeteries are as follows: Hove Cemetery – North; Woodingdean Lawn Memorial; Brighton & Preston Cemetery; Woodvale; Bear Road Cemetery; St Nicholas' (Anglican); Rottingdean; Peacehaven at 2.30 p.m. and Newhaven at 4 p.m.

In November, when there is no feast day, we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the dead, provided the Mass intention is for a deceased person; that is to say that we shall celebrate the Mass in the Missal designated 'for several deceased persons or for all the dead.' On the commemoration of All Souls the Mass at 7.30pm is for all the faithful departed. If you wish for a name to be included in the Eucharistic Prayer, please give it to Fr Alexander, in writing, in good time.

This November is given particular poignance by the fact that it is 100 years since the end of the First World War. We shall be marking Armistice Day, 11th November, which falls on a Sunday this year, with particular solemnity. In addition, because 'At the going down of the sun we shall remember them', it is proposed to have the Vespers for the Dead followed by Rosary at 4pm on every Sunday in November. The Office does not take long, and the Rosary is an excellent way to pray for the faithful

departed and for peace in the world. Do please come along. The combined Rosary and Office will not take more than half an hour.

Thursday is the Solemnity of All Saints. Mass at 10am and 7.30pm. Friday is the Commemoration of All Souls. Mass at 10am and 7.30pm. Saturday is the feast of Saint Martin de Porres.

According to the guidelines issued by the diocese, parishes are meant to hold an annual day of recollection for all Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist. This rule is more honoured in the breach than by the observance, but several of you have suggested we hold one, and it does seem like a good idea. The proposed date is **Saturday 8th December**, if you would like to put that in your diaries now. The day will start with Mass at 10am, and end by 4pm at the latest. There will be a session on the spirituality of Eucharistic devotion, and a practical session as well. We shall have lunch in the Hall, so please bring something to eat. This day is coincidentally the feast of the Immaculate Conception. At a later date we will need to organise a similar event for readers, and one for welcomers.

We also need to hold some training for servers. It is proposed that all servers who wish to find out more about serving on the altar, should gather at 6pm in the church on Friday 30th November. At this session we will also explain the purpose of enrolment in the Guild of Saint Stephen. Afterwards we will go for fish and chips, or pizza. Parents of servers, please note the date now; the session will finish by 8pm. Because of child/adult ratios, if parents want to stay for the session

and the fish and chips, please feel free; otherwise leave contact details.

The next Baptism Class (for want of a better phrase) is on Monday 5th November in the presbytery meeting room. Fr Alexander likes to meet parents before the class, so if you get in contact with him via email beforehand, that would be excellent. Is there anyone in the parish who would like to get involved in baptism catechesis?

Please help publicise our concert on Saturday 10th November. It is a fitting way to mark the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. If you are able to display a poster, please do so. Tickets can be bought on the door on the day, or after Mass on Sundays.

As a way of **preparing for Christmas** (yes, a long way off, but useful to think of things in advance) we are going to hold four sessions of Bible study based on the Infancy Narrative of Saint Luke, that is the first two chapters of Saint Luke's Gospel. Discussion will focus particularly on the canticles known as the Magnificat, the Benedictus, the

Gloria and the Nunc Dimmitis. These will be on Thursday evenings in Advent, starting the week before Advent begins on 29th November. You might like to note these dates now. The sessions will start at 8pm, and will end by 9.30pm at the very latest.

There will be plenty of time for discussion and questions. All you need to bring is a Bible. All are welcome. They will take place in the Presbytery meeting room.

The Upstairs Room in the Hall, once designated 'the Club Room' needs repainting, as well as a thorough clean and dejunking; once this is achieved we can use the room for meetings instead of the presbytery dining room, which can be turned into the Parish office (much better that the current cramped quarters upstairs). Moreover, the Upper Room can be kept under lock and key when not in use, and thus can be used to store our tea and coffee etc. Fr Alexander proposes to clean out the room on Tuesday 30th October. Many hands make light work. Would anyone like to help in this useful and no doubt community building exercise? It is proposed to start after 10am Mass. All hands on deck, or all that can make it, greatly appreciated.
